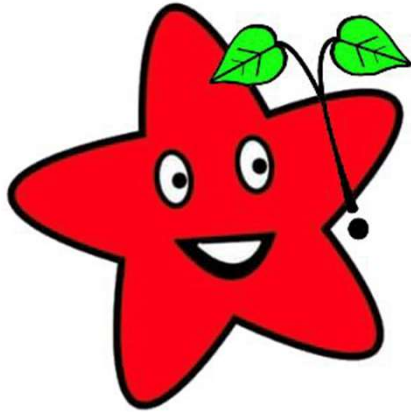

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# LESSON INTRODUCTION

- Lesson Title: Tree Craft
- Age Range: 6 weeks – 24 months
- Lesson Domain: Physical Development
- Lesson Objective:
  - Motor skills
  - Demonstrates positive approaches to learning





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# DEVELOPMENTAL GOAL

- Lesson Objective: Demonstrates fine-motor skills and positive approaches to learning
- What are we trying to accomplish?
  - Using the season crafts to reinforce learning about spring, summer, fall, and winter
  - Explore the changing of seasons
  - Good opportunity to talk to the kids about the change in nature and how trees are affected
  - Help them practice fine motor skills and get creative





# MATERIALS

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Here is what you need:

- Blue parchment paper or cardstock paper
- Cotton balls
- Glue
- Toilet paper or paper towel roll cut in half
- Scissors
- Paint
- Paint brushes
- Construction paper





# METHOD

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- Here is what to do:
  - Cut the paper roll in half and glue one half on the bottom of the cardstock paper (vertically)
  - Glue cotton balls with the corresponding colors of the season
    - Spring: pink and green
    - Winter: white
    - Fall: orange and brown
    - Summer: green





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# METHOD

- Cut out two thin strips of green construction paper and glue them at the bottom of each side of the tree
- Cut out two clouds (white construction paper) or a sun (yellow construction paper) and place them about the trees





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# MOTIVATIONS AND INTERACTIONS

- Here are some tips to keep in mind when motivating and interacting with your child in this exercise.
  - Invite the children to join you on the tree craft
  - Let the children paint the cotton balls with the colors of each season
  - Demonstrates why you are using the colors and how they relate to the season
